We pride ourselves on teaching serious skills that each camper will be able to carry on with after the week of camp is over—we are not simply engaging in busy work to keep a child entertained for a short amount of time, but teaching serious skills (in a fun way!) that they will be able to use and expand upon for the rest of their lives. To nurture these skills, we have sourced and, in many cases, designed good, solid equipment that each camper will keep after the week of camp is over, along with a notebook containing a summary of instructions, so that they can go home and continue to build upon the skills they learned at camp.
